

ABSTRACT

BIGFOOT is a mythological creature of many names across many parts of the world. From the swamps of the Southeastern United States (known there as a Skunk Ape) to the peaks of Asia where it's referenced as a Yeti, BIGFOOT continues to reverberate itself and it's infamy in both our culture, media and tourism.

Many countries, states and cities tout being the "Home of Bigfoot", while countless movies, shows and even concerts center around this elusive beast. There is even a dedicated annual convention centered solely around Mr. Squatch. creatures, BIGFOOT continues to remain king.







Multiple Usage: Aside from depicting the mythical legend himself (or herself), BIGFOOT can also be used to narrate movement, question location, or represent stealth and mystery.

Use in Sequences:



Breaking New Ground: The BIGFOOT emoji stands on it's own, representing a symbol of folklore that feels absent from the current Fantasy/Creature line-up. While the closest shape resemblance could be akin to PERSON WALKING or PERSON RUNNING, the BIGFOOT emoji embodies a culture and personality that extends beyond the literal use of the aforementioned existing options.

Distinctiveness: As mentioned above, there are currently no other emojis that accurately and concisely represent the idea of BIGFOOT. Known for the infamous Patterson-Gimlin photo, the gait and walking stance of BIGFOOT is immediately recognizable.

Completeness: N/A

Frequently Requested: BIGFOOT is not on the list as a frequently requested emoji, but is often a reference in social media and other venues. It's absence amongst VAMPIRE, ALIEN, FAIRY, etc. is apparent, and currently is only satisfied by using FOOT (which pales in comparison).

SELECTION FACTORS - EXCLUSION

Overly Specific: BIGFOOT is not overly specific, as it represents both a mythological creature as well as the culture and mystery it represents.

Open-Ended: I do not believe that the addition of TROLL will open up a new category of emoji.

Already Representable: As stated earlier, there are no other emoji that currently

represent or come close to a combination that would easily represent BIGFOOT.

Logos, brands, other third-party IP rights, UI icons, signage, specific people, specific buildings and landmarks, deities: BIGFOOT is none of the above. It is a generic mythic/fantasy creature common in folklore.

Transient: BIGFOOT has only been increasing in popularity and culture. With more countries and states leveraging this figure in tourism, as well as TV and movies highlighting it, BIGFOOT is far from being a fad.

Faulty Comparison: N/A

Exact Images: This proposal does not request an exact image, but does identify that the gait and stance of BIGFOOT should remain intact so as to remain recognizable by it's infamous silhouette.
