#### 1. Introduction

This proposal aims to update the shape of the symbol currently encoded in the Unicode Standard under the code point U+FDFC, representing the Saudi Riyal symbol. The Saudi Central Bank has adopted a new design for the Riyal symbol as part of an initiative to enhance the visual identity of the currency and ensure its compatibility with global financial systems. The new design reflects the cultural heritage of the Kingdom and its modern financial aspirations, as outlined in recent announcements by the Saudi Central Bank.

## 2. Symbol Information

## 3. Rationale for the Update

The Saudi Central Bank has adopted the new Riyal symbol design to achieve the following objectives:

Current Shape: The existing shape of the U+FDFC symbol is outdated and does not reflect the newly adopted design.

Proposed Shape: The new shape is a modern representation of the word «Riyal» in Arabic script, designed to be clear, easily recognizable, and compatible with various digital platforms.

Font File: A font file containing the updated shape is provided (see attachment: RiyalFont.ttf).

Shape Image: A high-resolution image of the proposed shape is included (see attachment: Guidelines.pdf).

The design adheres to the Unicode Consortium's guidelines for currency symbols, ensuring clarity, readability, and cross-platform compatibility.

### 5. Usage

The updated Riyal symbol is intended for use in:

Financial documents and reports.

Digital payment systems and banking applications.

E-commerce platforms and commercial transactions.

Official government publications.

The symbol will be positioned to the left of the numeric value in all languages, with a clear space between the symbol and the amount, in accordance with the Saudi Central Bank's guidelines.
