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This is an addendum to $\underline{L2/24-050}$, IPA letters with palatal hook. A number of such letters theoretically remain, though it is likely that most of them were never used. A few however do appear to be accidental gaps. One of those, w, has now been found.

The palatal hook was retired by the IPA after the Kiel convention of 1989. The last official alphabet chart to support it was that of 1979, published as a supplement to JIPA (International Phonetic Association 1978). Table 1 shows palatal-hook and palatal-curl modifications of letters in that chart. (See Figure 3 for the published chart.)




Figure 2. Winnick (1972: 43). Besides $\langle w \rangle$, we have s with a left palatal hook, $\langle s \rangle$, which is an allograph of U+1D8A $\langle s \rangle$.

Letters attested with a palatal hook or curl are circled in blue, with the requested letter w in red. Some others – such as the glottals *?, * f_1 or the implosives * f_2 , * f_3 – may be accidental gaps in attestation, but many of the remainder – particularly the palatal consonants and the click consonants (grey) – are unlikely to have ever been used. Winnick (1972: 30 f_1 , 188 f_1), for example, uses bare $\langle c \downarrow c \rangle$ for palatalized equivalents of f_3 f_4 despite using the palatal hook extensively with other IPA letters. (Unicode f_3 is actually an allograph of velar f_4 , not a palatalized palatal letter f_4 .) Also circled in grey are the ejectives and labial-velar plosives, which as sequences of Unicode-supported characters do not need separate encoding.
