# 3. Achievements since last SC2 Meeting

Here is a summary of the work done by IRG recently:

 M18.3 & M19.3 Single Column Issue discussed twice and come up with feedback to WG2

- M18.8 & M19.4 TrueType Font Issue studied twice and come up with resolutions
- M19.6 Carefully reviewed the error report on Encoded Ideographs, and summarized some error cases, and generated a proposal on Error Correction (WG2 N2448).
- M20.2 An Ad Hoc group was set up and document (IRGN947, WG2 N2539) was produced to address the need, scope, criteria and submission schedule of the Basic Subset of CJK Unified Ideographs.
- The huge amount submissions for CJK Unified Ideographs Extension C (C1) are received, consolidated, reviewed, and formed version 2.0. The current CJK Extension C1 contains about **24,365** Ideographs after unification Below is the character numbers in CJK Extension C1 from each IRG members:

- More importantly, based on the practice in processing CJK Unified Ideographs, IRG summarized a few Directive-like rules for
  - Clarification of Ideograph Unifications WG2 N2535
  - IRG Radical Classification WG2 N2534
  - Determining the Strokes and the first stroke of ideographs WG2 N 2533, and N2533A
