Title: Information technology -- Universal Multiple-Octet Coded Character Set (UCS) –

Scope: Incorporate an additional 281 characters as identified below.

Rationale: The proposed scripts and characters are based on contributions from several national body, liaison organizations and other expert linguists. These proposed characters were approved at meeting 57 of JTC1/SC2/WG2 held in Busan, Republic of Korea in October 2010 per Resolution (N3904) M57.22 which contains the list of these additional scripts and characters.
