#### 1. Introduction

This is a proposal to encode one Bopomofo letter.

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Mandarin Chinese has a few characters that are pronounced as a syllabic nasal, *m*, *n*, or *ng*. In the PRC (e.g. in *Xiàndài Hànyǔ Cídiǎn* 现代汉语词典 [Contemporary Chinese Dictionary]) these syllabic nasals are represented using U+3107 BOPOMOFO LETTER M  $\sqcap$ , U+310B BOPOMOFO LETTER N  $\Im$ , and U+312B BOPOMOFO LETTER NG  $\pi$ .




Fig. 3: Guóyǔ cídiǎn 國語辭典 p. 417 (U+31AC П and U+31AD 兀)




Fig. 4: https://zh.wikipedia.org/wiki/注音符號 (2016-02-05)

However, in early sources, notably the 1937 *Guóyǔ cídiǎn* 國語辭典 [Dictionary of the National Language], and in some Taiwan books, the syllabic nasals are represented by a set of special Bopomofo letters derived from the Bopomofo letters M, N, and NG, but with a vertical stroke in the middle (see Fig. 1, Fig. 2, and Fig. 3). The syllabic letters M and NG with a vertical stroke are already encoded as U+31AC BOPOMOFO LETTER IM  $\square$  and U+31AD BOPOMOFO LETTER NGG  $\pi$ . However, the corresponding syllabic letter N, derived from U+310B BOPOMOFO LETTER N with a vertical stroke in the middle, is not currently encoded. This is problematic, as explained in the Chinese Wikipedia article on Bopomofo (see Fig. 4).

Fig. 1 shows the unencoded Bopomofo letter NN with an attached falling tone mark. This mark is not part of the character.



1932年教育部在「編定《國音常用字彙》特組會議」時決定,為了便利說明,添補一個注 音符號「币」(币),作為「坐々アAPちム」七個聲母單獨成音節時的省略韻母(即虚 母)。另外有三個注音符號皿(-ng)、町(-m)、乃(-n),用作解釋聲隨韻母(弓、 ち、た、と)時使用,(-n)的字形是 3多加一筆直豎,た解作 Y+皿、と解成 t+皿、弓 為 Y+(-n)、 5為 t+(-n);同理,複韻母 5 解為 Y+-、 幺為 Y+X。皿、町、 (-n) 絕少單獨使用,「嗯」常唸作「5」,也有人唸成「(-n)」。但以上符號只作為 發音輔助說明用 未列入正式符號表中。

1986年,中華民國教育部公佈羅馬字拼寫的「注音符號第二式」,注音符號因此又稱為 「第一式」。

使用現況 [编辑]

在臺灣,小學生學習漢字前,必須上十週的注音符號教學課,也有不少幼稚園亦已教授。 日常生活中,注音符號既用來標注生僻字,亦是常用的漢字輸入法,其推廣相當普遍,多 數電腦使用者均熟練使用。

在臺灣話、客家話的教學上,臺灣省國語推行委員會另外增添新符號以能拼讀這些「鄉土 語言」,稱之為「臺語方音符號」,比如臺灣話音節的皿、Ⅲ,被正式訂為臺語方音符 號,載入Unicode注音符號擴展區用字,(-n)則沒有收入,故無法顯示。

在中國大陸及港澳,学校不教注音符号,但是一些字典、词典都通过汉语拼音与注音符号 并列使用的方式给字词注音,如《新华字典》、《现代汉语词典》等。
