2. This symbol is a component of the word “Sri” which is an equivalent salutation of “Mister” in English. Without this symbol, a big community cannot write “Mr.” in their native language unicode fonts.

3. The symbol is used in day to day language by 400 million hindi speakers.

4. It is only present in legacy (non-unicode) fonts like “Kruti Dev”, “Krishna”, but is absent in “Devanagari” unicode block.

Devanagari is close to Gujarati in its script, and this important symbol is correctly present in

Gujarati unicode block as શ્રી , hence shall be present in the Devanagari block too considering its huge importance.

5. Current transliterations of ‘sri’ in hindi (Devanagari) as rendered as combination of multiple characters as श्री , which is incorrect and never used practically anywhere in literature, publications or books.
