Proposal to change the accepted character names for A7F5 and A7F6

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In L2/19-092, an epigraphic Latin case pair for Roman inscriptions was proposed, which was later approved by UTC #159. The accepted names for the two letters U+A7F5 and U+A7F6 are hereby proposed to be changed from LATIN CAPITAL LETTER REVERSED HALF H and LATIN SMALL LETTER REVERSED HALF H to LATIN CAPITAL LETTER RIGHT HALF H and LATIN SMALL LETTER RIGHT HALF H respectively. This has two main reasons:

- 1. The current name is not one that would be used in the letter's description and is rather confusing. A "reversed half H" is still a half H; there is no reason for it to be called reversed. One would call it either simply a half H or, being more precise, a right half H. As the first name is already assigned to a character in the UCS, the latter one is proposed to be used.
- 2. "reversed half H" could suggest the letter is derived from or otherwise related to the "half H", which has a totally different history and is not to be confused with it. The names proposed here would prevent misinterpretations.

The suggested names would be more descriptive, and therefore I think they are more appropriate to be used.
