Hi Debbie,

I attach the basic numbers and the images. Three of the five cooccurrences are abecedaries (Abc CB / Abc TP1 / Abc TP2), all three from the Lliria zone, and only two normal inscriptions (F.13.3 and C.17.1), but with multiple texts that does not assure completely that all are from the same hand, especially C.17.1, and less probably F.13.3, as it's from Lliria, like the abecedaries. This sign is always transcribed as 'o', and only when there are a cooccurrence we mark the more complex one, always the first one in the abecedaries, as 'ó'. We need only two codes.
