According to the resolutions of IRG#13, an IRG editorial meeting was held in Aug. 25-27, 1999, Beijing. Editors from China, Japan, Korea, Vietnam, HKSAR, TCA and Unicode Consortium / USA reviewed SuperCJK 8.0 and Extension B 5.0. The following documents are produced from the reviewing effort.

Missing character report. The characters are missing due to improper unification assumption applied previously and has been removed through previous reviews. Those will be put back accordingly.

Missing source code report. Each member added additional source code information to the SuperCJK 8.0.

Duplicated characters in KangXi dictionary report. As stated by its subject, those are the duplicated characters in the KangXi dictionary.

Wrong background/foreground color report. Those are documented with wrong background/foreground color in the SuperCJK 8.0. Those will be corrected in the SuperCJK 9.0.

Glyph revision report. This is a revision to the glyph used in the SuperCJK 8.0.

Unification report. This is a revision by further unification of SuperCJK 8.0.

De-unification report. Those are the characters being listed in the same code point in SuperCJK 8.0. After further reviewed by editors, separation is needed due to the wrong unification to the KangXi traditional glyph.

Ext-B revision report. There are certain characters raised by Ext-B review team that require further attention from editors.

Further, here are the action items from the IRG editorial meeting:

Any font used by the SuperCJK 8.0 software should not be used by any other means other than SuperCJK editing effort.

The unification rules, except the source code separation rule, defined in the Annex T are applied to the unification revision effort.

All IRG members will receive the SuperCJK 9.0 and the reports stated above by September 10. All members are required to review the result of this editorial meeting and bring their issues or report to the next IRG meeting at Singapore.
