**SUMMARY:** 

- 1. After handover, the Committee for Unification of Computer Chinese Character Encoding was founded at the beginning of 2001, aiming at unifying different user-defined Chinese characters among public service departments, as well as private firms.
- 2. Since then, the Committee started to collect glyphs and codes of user-defined Characters among 50 and more service departments. Till November of 2001, 252 Characters were consolidated, by comparing them to the Super CJK 130 version character map obtained on the 17<sup>th</sup> ISO/IRG Meeting in June of 2001 in Hong Kong.
- 3. After prudential clarification of these characters, by excluding most of those unreasonably invented characters, mainly by wrong presentation of stroke, 6 (six)

characters (see the following table) are sorted out, which are identified as of daily used in Macao and with strong reasonable origin. The committee of Macao thus would like to submit them to the ISO/IRG, for consideration of their inclusion to the ISO/IEC 10646 standard.

- 4. Of these six characters, some are being used in citizens' names, and the rest are either used in geographical properties, or usual articles. That's to say, they are now in active circulation in Macao.
- 5. Because Macao has been late joining the ISO/IRG, even though it sounds unacceptable,

the committee would like to request all IRG members to kindly consider the situation, and allow these six characters to be admitted into the <u>CJK Unified Ideographs</u> (4E00 – 9FFF, there are still 74 vacancies), or to its <u>Extension A (3400 – 4DFF, there are still 80 vacancies)</u>, by making it as an amendment to existing standard (CJK core or Ext. A), when Extension B is published. In case this point is rejected, so there will be a formal written decision on the 18<sup>th</sup> Meeting's resolution for us to report to our government officials.

- 6. Furthermore, if the proposal on point 5 is rejected, please consider including these characters into Extension C.
- 7. Besides, there is another set of around 12 (twelve) characters of Macao, which are invented and used mainly in citizens' names, that members of linguistics of our Committee might consider their probable submission for inclusion into Extension C, in the course of 18<sup>th</sup> Meeting in Tokyo, Japan.
