Minutes of the Editorial Group Ad Hoc Discussion on WG2 #44 Resolution (IRG N978r)

A. Follow-up actions in the WG2 Resolutions (IRG N978r)

Discussion Item 1.

The Editorial Group studied the WG2 Resolution M44.7 (**IRG N978r**), recapped in italic below:

'WG2 instructs IRG to investigate the many missing source references for CJK Unified Ideographs located in the CJK Compatibility block (listed on top of page 2 in document N2667, under item 2a), and provide the missing source references for inclusion in CJKU_Sr.txt file to the project editor before 2003-12-15. The project editor is instructed to include these as part of the next amendment to the standard.'

The Editorial group reviewed the 12 characters listed on top of page 2 in document N2667. The Group agreed that the 12 characters do not have IRG national source. The characters were inserted because of Unicode requirement documented in page 295 of *The Unicode Standard Version 4.0*. The characters do not have IRG mapping to the other ideograph standards.

Discussion Item 2.

The Editorial Group studied the WG2 Resolution M44.8, and instructed the HKSAR delegation, Japan delegation and Unicode to review the suggested actions in the resolution, with a view for decision and response to the WG2. IRG concurs with the WG2 resolution.

Discussion Item 3. Action: R. O. Korea

The Editorial Group studied the WG2 Resolution M44.9, R. O. Korea delegates will study the implications of the resolution and reply to WG2 with a copy to the IRG Chief Editor before December 15, 2003.

Discussion Item 4 Action: IRG Members, China primary responsible

The Editorial Group studied the WG2 Resolution M44.17 item c). The Editorial Group knew that there were incomplete information missing in the dictionary data. The five dictionaries identified are listed below:

G_KX 20,363, G_HZ 10,849, G CY 66, G_CH 247, G HC 553.

The IRG Members will review and provide supplementary information of G_KX and G_HZ data in Super CJK, if any, to the Technical Editor before the First of February 2004. China will consolidate the input. China will also supply additional information related to the G_CY, G_CH and G_HC for WG2's information. China will also study and look for additional information from the other three dictionaries.

Discussion Item 5. Action: Clarifications to WG2, if required.

The Editorial Group studied the WG2 Resolution M44.17 item d). The IRG accepted the assurance from HKSAR that all the characters in the HKSCS-2001 had been submitted to the IRG for consideration to include them in the ISO 10646.

Discussion Item 6. Action: China

The Editorial Group studied the WG2 Resolution M44.17 item e). Extract is recapped 'On the correct glyph to use for the characters 21E2D (G_4K source reference) and 21E45 (G_HZ source reference)'. China had checked the 21E45 by looking up details of the character from the G_HZ. It was found that although the glyph of 21E45 in the G_HZ was incorrect, it should be displayed as that in the ISO 10646-2:2001. The result will be reported to the WG2.
