- The "Computer Chinese Character Encoding Workgroup" of Macao SAR was

- 3. In the coming year, we are going to arrange related administrative and technical facilities, such as working guidelines, fonts, web site, etc, to help successfully implement the unification framework, and further promote the ISO 10646 standard to the public.

"Macao Information Systems Character Set" is a character set that Macao public departments will use to exchange information. It is based on ISO/IEC 10646 standard plus the characters in Macao Supplementary Character Set (MSCS).
