- After attending the IRG#34 in Japan, the Computer Chinese Characters Encoding Workgroup has conveyed the IRGN 1698 document to member departments. Related departments have prepared the evidences for their characters submitted and asked for the approval from the authority. The evidences will be presented in the IRG#35 meeting.
- 2. Some characters submitted by Macao SAR seem to be missing in CJK Ext. E. We would like to work with IRG members and follow it up in this meeting.
- 3. In order to successfully implement the MISCS¹ unification standard, a trial run was conducted in our Workgroup. We are going to publish a guideline to adopt the MISCS as the information exchange encoding standard among Macao public departments. The departments will have a transitional period to test and convert their current systems to MISCS unification standard.
- 4. It is honorable of Macao SAR to have the opportunity to host the IRG#35! This meeting helps us to raise the awareness of ISO 10646 standard in both Macao government and public. We sincerely appreciate all IRG members' participation. Wish you all a pleasant stay here, and have a fruitful meeting!

¹ The Macao Information Systems Character Set (MISCS) is a character set that Macao public departments use to exchange information. It is based on ISO/IEC 10646 standard plus the characters in Macao Supplementary Character Set (MSCS).
